






Human beings were made in the image of God to display the glory of God to to the ends of the earth.

Despite Israel's call to be a blessing to the world, God's people need continual rescuing from their brokenness.




JUDGES






Having a king, like the other nations, revealed that God's people need both a perfect leader as well as virtuous citizens.

When we repent/confess our sin, God forgives and heals us. But we still have to face the consequences of our choices.



 11 He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him.










JOHN 1:14

JOHN 1:4-5

4 In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.



He is certain - initiates conversation with a proclamation.

"Rabbi, we know you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the miraculous sings you are doing if God were not with him." (Jn. 3:2)

THE WOMAN




She is uncertain - responds to Jesus with a question.

"You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink? (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.)" (Jn. 4:9)

GOSPEL.



One of the biggest remaining obstacles to your accepting Christ is your addiction to certainty.



He misunderstands Jesus at first, and is unable to recover.

"How can a man be born when he is old?"
Nicodemus asked.
"Surely he cannot enter a second time into his mother's womb to be born!" (Jn. 3:4)

THE WOMAN



She misunderstands
Jesus at first, but is
able to recover.

"Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with & the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than Jacob...?" (Jn. 4:11-12a)



He fades out of the conversation.

His remarks get shorter and shorter. In Greek, he moves from 24 words (3:2) to 18 (3:4) to 4 (3:9) to nothing (3:22).


THE WOMAN



She remains active in the conversation.

She moves from defensive (4:9) to practical (4:11-15) to theological (4:19-20) to hopeful (4:25).

GOSPEL

Faith in Christ is a process -a struggle of letting go of what you thought you knew in order to be remade into God's likeness.



Jesus does not expose the motives of Nicodemus.


Jesus, "would not entrust himself to the crowds... because he knew what was in a man." (Jn. 2:24-25)
The text links this idea to Nicodemus in 3:1.

THE WOMAN



Jesus exposes the brokenness of the Samaritan Woman.

Jesus said to her, "You are right when you say you have no husband. The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you have is not your husband." (Jn. 4:17-18a)




JOHN 3:19-21

¹⁹ This is the verdict: Light has come into the world, but people loved darkness instead of light because their deeds were evil.

²⁰ Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed.




JOHN 3:19-21

²¹ But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God.

GOSPEL



Salvation requires that we bring our brokenness into the light-even though that's the last thing we want to do with it.



He makes no progress in understanding Jesus.

Nicodemus makes an incorrect assumption about who Jesus is based on the miracles that Jesus has performed. But he leaves not having any clearer picture of the identity of Jesus.

THE WOMAN



She progresses in her understand of Jesus.

The woman moves from animosity, "You are a Jew," (4:9) to respect, "Sir," (4:15) to wonder, "I can see that you are a prophet," (4:19) to a *full revelation* that Jesus is the Messiah (4:26).



He does not believe in the testimony of Jesus.

Jesus tells Nicodemus, "I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things?" (3:12)


THE WOMAN



She becomes a disciple doing God's work.

"Many of the Samaritans from that town believed him because of the woman's testimony... they said... we know this man really is the Savior of the world." (4:39-42)

GOSPEL

People who have truly experienced the saving grace of Christ become authentic disciples who live life on mission with God.
