After the two days he left for Galilee. (Now Jesus himself had pointed out that a prophet has no honor in his own country.) When he arrived in Galilee, the Galileans welcomed him. They had seen all that he had done in Jerusalem at the Passover Festival, for they also had been there.

Once more he visited Cana in Galilee, where he had turned the water into wine. And there was a certain royal official whose son lay sick at Capernaum.

When this man heard that Jesus had arrived in Galilee from Judea, he went to him and begged him to come and heal his son, who was close to death.

“Unless you people see signs and wonders,”
Jesus told him, “you will never believe.”

The royal official said,

“Sir, come down before my child dies.”

“Go,” Jesus replied, “your son will live.”

The man took Jesus at his word and departed.

While he was still on the way, his servants met him with the news that his boy was living. When he inquired as to the time when his son got better, they said to him, “Yesterday, at one in the afternoon, the fever left him.”

Then the father realized that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, “Your son will live.” So he and his whole household believed. This was the second sign Jesus performed after coming from Judea to Galilee.

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The First Sign at Cana

1. Jesus' mother reports that the host has run out of wine.
2. Jesus rebuffs his mother and ignores her request.
3. Jesus' mother tells the servants to do whatever he tells them.
4. Jesus commands the servants, “Fill the jars.”
5. The servants obey Jesus’ word.
6. The servants “who had drawn the water” know.
7. The disciples believe.

The Second Sign at Cana

1. The official comes to Jesus with a request that his son be healed.
2. Jesus rebuffs or ignores the request.
3. The official renews his petition.
4. Jesus commands the official, “Go. Your son will live.”
5. The man obeys Jesus’ word.
6. Corroboration by the servants know when “his fever left him.”
7. The official and his household believe.
