

## Stockport to crack down on wandering chickens

The Stockport Village Council met at 7 p.m. Monday, Aug. 15, at the HECK Harkins Community Center and opened with an invocation led by Councilman John Koch. Councilman Roger McBride led the Pledge of Allegiance, and Mayor Donna Dixon called the meeting to order. Councilmen Zac Cybulski was absent and excused. Fiscal Dixon Rathy Council was absent and excused. Fiscal purp were also in attendance.

The minutes for the general meeting held on July 18, sere approved unanimously, and Mayor Dixon opened he floor to visitors' concerns. There were no concerns,

but one citizen rose to voice appreciation for all the efforts being made to improve the appearance of the town.

After that, council took up the concerns of council members. McBride addressed a specific property on Main Street that has not been mowed in a very long time. Fiscal Officer Corwin responded that she has spoken to the property owners, and they will be sending out a crew to take care of that. It has been a struggle finding the right contact person, but they now have sorted that out so it should be a simple matter to get cooperation when that property needs attention in the future.

Administrator Dunn had a few things to bring to the attention of council. First was an update on the sewage processing equipment that has been ordered. The "Muffin Monster" is scheduled to ship August 28. Once onsite, it will be installed in short order. He also advised the village has received a load of salt and suggested that council consider getting a second load this year. Usually, one load is just enough to get through the season, but this winter is projected to be worse than usual. Each load is 10 tons and there is room to store it. Councilman Koch supported the idea, especially since the price may very well

And so John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.


The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him.




#### What I thought marathon training consisted of:




